Development of Fourth Integrated Health Service Plan Underway

Understanding and incorporating the perspectives of residents into the planning of their local health care system, reflects a fundamental belief that the health care needs of communities are best understood by those who live and work in them.

The Central West Local Health Integration Network (LHIN) is now in the process of developing its fourth Integrated Health Service Plan (IHSP 4), and invites local residents to become involved in planning their local health system by providing feedback through completion of a brief online survey.

Meeting the complex health care needs of a rapidly growing, aging and culturally diverse population requires smart local planning, and an ability to address broader provincial priorities.

When complete, IHSP 4 will outline the LHIN's local priorities for the three year period April 1, 2016 through March 31, 2019. It will also align with Ontario's *Patients First*: Action Plan for Healthcare by continuing to improve access, better connecting services, making evidence-based decisions on value and quality that will sustain the system for generations to come and providing people with the education and information they need to make the right decisions about their health.
